



## Update on Protests and Shortages in Cuba

### Protests in Eastern Cuba

During the month of March, demonstrators filled the streets of four eastern Cuba cities in rare protests, calling for food and electricity provisions amid widespread shortages throughout the country.

These protests are non-violent and have not impacted travellers, we continue to monitor the situation and give our support to the people in expressing their needs.

Cuba's economy has not fully recovered since the COVID pandemic; Currency reform has led to continually high inflation; U.S. economic restrictions on Cuba and delayed plans to build links between the Cuban and U.S. private sectors have stifled the recovery process. These are key elements contributing to the current situation facing the Cuban population.

### Food Shortages

Food shortages have minimal impact on private hotels, guesthouses, restaurants, cafes, and bars that supply services for the tourist industry. These small, locally-owned businesses can import their own provisions. However, food shortages do impact state-owned and operated establishments.

### Fuel and Energy Shortages

In Havana, power disruptions have been minimal, but provinces are experiencing prolonged outages. Residents are usually advised in advance of planned outage times, when possible, your guide will keep you informed of scheduled outages.

Our local team works to minimise the impact on your itinerary, but some activities could be affected. Because of potential power outages at night consider bringing **a battery-operated fan, power bank, flashlight, and mosquito repellent with DEET** to enhance your comfort. Some guesthouses have generators to help reduce the impact of power outages; however, as these can sometimes be noisy, **earplugs** may help you sleep better.
